### OPENING CEREMONY OF THE JOINT LL.M PROGRAM IN CYBER CRIMINAL LAW AND DIGITAL FORENSICS AND THE INDIAN-UZBEK LAW AND LANGUAGE RESEARCH CENTER

The opening ceremony of the joint LL.M Program in Cyber Criminal Law and Digital Forensics between Tashkent State University of Law (TSUL) and India's National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU) will take place on October 28, 2024, at TSUL's Conference Hall (Room 203, Building 1) from 11:30 to 13:00. This first-of-its-kind program in Central Asia combines advanced legal education with practical digital forensics training.

The curriculum focuses on cyber criminal law, digital evidence handling, blockchain forensics, cloud computing investigations, and cross-border cybercrime procedures. Students will receive hands-on training in state-of-the-art digital forensics laboratories and complete internships with law enforcement agencies. The program features advanced investigation tools and software, with students gaining practical experience through workshops and real-case simulations.

The ceremony will also include the opening of the Indian-Uzbek Law and Language Research Center, which will support the program through comparative legal research and cross-cultural academic exchange.

These initiatives respond to the growing demand for cyber law specialists in Central Asia and strengthen academic collaboration between Uzbekistan and India in legal education.

Graduates will be prepared for careers in law enforcement, corporate cybersecurity, digital forensics consulting, and cyber law practice. The program represents a strategic response to the rapidly evolving landscape of cybercrime and digital security challenges in the region.
